what do I do if my student has	I here are multiple scenarios here for awarding Algebra I credit:	
already completed Algebra I		
and would like to take a higher math class?	Olif a non-PUSD student took and passed Algebra I in 8th grade through an accredited HS program then we will honor and post the grade off of the HS transcript (Example - BASIS students w/ high school transcript OR West Wing student with SDOC high school transcript). In this example the student DOES NOT need to Competency Test and it is the parent's responsibility to contact the awarding HS upon completion of the class and request that the transcripts be sent to LHS. It is recommended that the parent also communicate this with the counselor assigned to do your student's enrollment.	
	 Any student that took and passed Algebra I at their elementary school that is NOT 9-12 accredited, must take a Competency Test to earn HS credit (Example - Candeo student since they are not 9-12 accredited or many out-of-state schools). 	
	O Any student that does not have the Algebra I credit on a high school transcript, will need to Competency Tests for Algebra I credit. The parent must sign them up through the link below and they will take the PUSD Algebra I final exam and the grade earned is what we will post on the HS transcript. If a student does not like their grade on the Competency Test and would like to retake the class with us then they have the option to deny the grade/credit earned on the Competency Test and take the class at LHS.
